## Key takeaway

In 2021, 2 persons was the most common household size among households in Gosnells (C), accounting for 29% (12,369 households). This share was lower than Greater Perth (32.9%). Since 2016, the biggest change was in 1 person, which increased by 1,606 households and 2.1 percentage points.

## About this topic

Household size shows how many people live in each household. It is a basic but important measure of family life, dwelling use, and the way people share housing.

This topic helps indicate demand for different dwelling sizes and can reflect life-cycle patterns, cultural norms, and affordability pressures. It is best read with household type, age structure, and dwelling type, because changes in household size can happen for very different reasons.

## Interpretation notes

- This counts the number of people usually resident in the dwelling, so it describes shared living arrangements rather than dwelling size.

- Household size should be read with bedrooms or dwelling structure before drawing conclusions about crowding or housing suitability.
