Sources and method

- Source: Australian Bureau of Statistics, Census of Population and Housing, 2021 and, where available, 2016 comparison data.
- Percentages are calculated from the denominator supplied for each topic. Change (pp) is the 2021 percentage minus the 2016 percentage when the topic is comparable across years.
- Usual residence topics describe where people usually live, rather than where they were counted on Census night.

Key takeaway

In 2021, English only was the most common English–proficiency response among residents in Yarra (C), accounting for 74.8% (67,385 people). This share was higher than Greater Melbourne (61.1%). Since 2016, the biggest change was in English only, which increased by 7,816 people and 6.1 percentage points.

About this topic

Proficiency in English records how well people say they speak English, with the question mainly relevant for people who use a language other than English at home. It is a self-assessed measure of spoken English rather than a formal test.

This topic helps identify where interpreting, translated information, and targeted service communication may be needed. It is most informative when read alongside language used at home, birthplace, and year of arrival.

Interpretation notes

– ABS treats this as a self-assessed indicator of spoken English, not a formal test, so results should be interpreted with care.

– The detailed English–proficiency categories mainly relate to people who use another language at home; people who speak English only are included as a separate category.
